Most examples from this mint of this period are worn coins. Rutter records ten examples only from this die combination. Cumae (modern Cuma) was the first Greek colony on the mainland of Italy (Magna Graecia) according to Strabo, It is an ancient city located (19 km) west of Naples. Cumae founded a number of colonies and grew to be an important regional power. It repulsed Etruscan and Umbrian attacks, but fell in the late 5th cent. BC to the Samnites. Cumae supported Rome in the second century BC and adopted Roman culture which lead ultimately to its inhabitants becoming Roman citizens.

Situated on the southern coast of Sicily, Gela was founded in 688 BC by Cretans and Rhodians. It rose to become the most influential state on the island. In 485 its ruler Gelon seized Syracuse and transferred his capital there, taking with him many of the leading citizens. His brother Hieron, later tyrant of Syracuse, was left in charge of Gela. Tetradrachm issues at Gela probably began circa 480 BC, shortly thereafter becoming the principal denomination of the Geloan coinage, and remaining so down to the time of the destruction of the city by Carthaginian invaders in 405 BC. The ultimate design of the tetradrachms displayed a racing chariot, borrowed from the Syracusan coinage, and the forepart of a man-headed bull. The rather brutal half-length figure of the man-headed bull swimming right is based on the 'father of all rivers', Achelous, and is clearly identified by the ethnic Gelas as the personification of the river Gelas rushing to its mouth, where the city Gela stood. It was defined by Virgil (Aen. 3, 702) as 'immanisque Gela fluvii cognomina dicta.'

We believe that to him should be ascribed some of the best made Arethusa heads, and namely Tudeer nos. 41, 42, 43, 46, 47, 52. Among these, in our opinion the masterpieces are nos. 42, 43 and 47 that, for their enchanting beauty, stand out from the others and represent the highest achievement in the coinage of classical time. Also the obverse die is well done where the engraver not only succeeds with consummate skill in conveying the motion of the quadriga, but also gives us an unusual representation of the charioteer who faces the spectators and, with his right hand raised, seems to turn to the public to celebrate his victory after having overcome the meta. The scene, so far unpublished, is altogether rendered with uncommon plasticity and harmony." Unsigned dies probably by the artist Eukleidas one of the great master engravers of Greek coinage. Mende was famous in the ancient world as an exporter of wine, and presumably made her fine series of these silver tetradrachms from the surplus of her trade. The designs refer to the trade, the grape vine and bunches occupy the centre of the reverse, while Dionysos, the god of wine, reclines on his sacred animal, the ass and contemplates the cup of wine from which he has drunk. The significance of the crow on the reverse is mysterious as the crow is not associated with Dionysos in mythology. The date of c.450 B.C. is based on earlier coins being those only present in the Asyut hoard and a similar die being used that was overstruck on a coin of Gela c.450-440 B.C.

Teos was founded at an early date by colonists from Orchomenos, followed by later settlers from elsewhere in Boeotia and Athenians. Perhaps this mixture of components lead to their adoption of the griffin as a civic symbol, a creature of both land and air. The griffin was also most appropriate as a coin type, a mythical beast who protected the gold deposits in the land of the Arimaspi in the far north and those of distant India. The fine silver coinage of Teos was just as secure. The griffin followed the Teans when they abandoned their city to found a new colony at Abdera in Thrace,

Xanthos has been suggested as the likely mint for this and related issues (See G.K. Jenkins, 'Recent acquisitions of Greek Coins by the British Museum', NC 1959, p.33). However the question is unresolved since this stater and all the related pieces in the SNG Berry, ACNAC Rosen and SNG Von Aulock all fall clearly into the heavy weight classification. Thus Morkholm has in 'The Classification of Lycian coins before Alexander the Great' (JNG 1964, pp 65ff), assembled evidence indicating that Xanthos was the home of the light standard and the heavy standard circulated in Central Lycia. That standard cannot be identified with any in use outside Lycia. The letter on the obverse represents a 'kh', the initial letter of the dynast's name. The triskeles on the reverse is a solar symbol and a distinctive Lycian emblem connected with the national deity, Apollo.

The helmet on the reverse has been the subject of much comment. Initially called by Madden in 1864 a vessel, others like Kindler in 1974 refer to it as a thymaterion (an incense burner). Meshorer and Hendin in more recent times called it a helmet. Its confirmation as a helmet was shown by Hendin in the Israel Numismatic Journal Vol.11 1990-1 in which a superb specimen clearly showed a wreathed helmet with a large leaf as a central device. Thus the object is a soldier's helmet with a wreath, cheek pieces and straps. Leaves on helmets were a suitable symbol and design motif at this time as Herod I did not depict human images on any of his coins.
