Gary McCue grew up near Rochester, New York, not far from Canada and Niagara Falls. As a young boy he started collecting US coins, regularly pouring through the tills at the bank in a small country town where his grand father was the manager.

In the early 1980s he began travelling around the world, initially in New Zealand and Australia before eventually settling in Nepal, where he lived for 20 years leading and organising trekking expeditions in the Himalaya and Tibet. He first visited China and Tibet in 1984, and quickly noticed the beautiful and unique coins of Tibet for sale in the local markets, as these coins were no longer legal tender in Tibet. Over the next 10 years Gary regularly visited markets and shops across the Tibetan Plateau, China, as well as in Nepal, to eventually build up a substantial collection of Tibetan coins and paper money, as well as coins of Nepal, China and British India. Gary now lives in the Blue Mountains, and still leads the occasional trek in Tibet and Nepal.
