Jules Sebastien Cesar Dumont d'Urville, French navigator, captained the 'Astrolabe' on the expedition to Australia and the Pacific in 1826. Cape Leeuwin was sighted on 5th October, 1826, two days later the 'Astrolabe' anchored in King George Sound and remained there for eighteen days.

Joseph Trickett, the Clerk of Works at Woolwich in England and a civil engineer arrived in New South Wales on 14 March 1854. He was also a member of the Royal Engineers, a detachment of which had been sent to Sydney to establish a branch of the Royal Mint. Trickett selected the location and supervised the establishment of the Sydney Mint which was opened on 14 May 1855. Joseph Trickett was involved in many other aspects of scientific work and was also heavily involved in the development of the municipality of Woollahra and for many years was a councillor. He returned to England after he retired from his position at the Sydney Mint and died there on 3 January 1878.

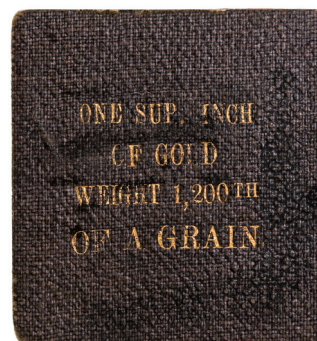
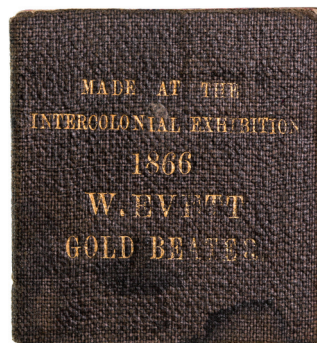

Robert Stuart Lord, born 22 April 1844 at 'Bonnavista', Avoca, Tasmania; Member of the Queensland Legislative Assembly; in 1870 appointed Magistrate of the Territory in Ravenswood, Queensland; in 1871 appointed as one of the Trustees of the Racecourse Reserve in Gympie, Queensland; represented the electoral district of Gympie from 7 November 1873 to 9 March 1877; Died 23 July 1878 at Gympie, Queensland.

Note: In Australian Agricultural Show Medals and Awards 1822-c1910 by Hugh Armstrong and Les Carlisle it states that Gympie held its first show in June 1878. It appears that this was in fact the second show as the above precedes it by several months.

George Thornton (23 December 1819 - 23 November 1901) was an Australian merchant and politician, serving as a Sydney Municipal Council Alderman, Mayor of Sydney and member of the New South Wales Legislative Assembly and Legislative Council. Thornton was born in Sydney, the son of Samuel Thornton (son of another Samuel, a woollen manufacturer of Barnsley, Yorkshire) and Sarah (n e Madden). Sarah was transported to Australia as a punishment for larceny; Samuel followed, arriving in Sydney in 1814 as a free settler, and was granted land by the colonial government.

George Thornton was educated at the Australian College on Jamieson Street, Sydney; he went into work as a custom-house and ship agent, later becoming an import merchant. Having been a magistrate in Sydney for many years, Thornton served also as a director of various financial institutions such as the City Bank of Sydney. He was elected to the Sydney Municipal Council in November 1847, and served as mayor in 1853 and 1857. Thornton was elected as a member for Sydney City from 1858 to 1859. In May 1861 he was appointed to the Legislative Council when Governor Young agreed to flood the council in support of John Robertson's land bills, but this was frustrated when the President of the Council, Sir William Burton refused to swear in the new members and resigned with others forcing the prorogement (suspension) of the Council. He represented Goldfields West in 1867 and 1868. In 1877 he was appointed for life to the Council. George Thornton was a commissioner of the 1879 Sydney International Exhibition and was a judge for Class 313 Musical Instruments. He also won a bronze medal in that class and was awarded a large silver medal for his services.

Thornton was the foundation President of the Sydney Rowing Club and was instrumental in the club's formation and growth from 1870 until his death. He served as President of the New South Wales Rowing Association from 1879 till his death. Thornton died of dysentery in 1901 at Parramatta, survived by his wife, Mary Ann (daughter of John Solomon, of Sydney) and daughter Frances; he was predeceased by a son and a daughter.

These medals relate to the 'Danedite' property in Camperdown. Originally formed as a part of the Purrumbete Estate taken up by three brothers Thomas (1809-1875), John (1811-1877) and Peter (1817-1885) Manifold who emigrated from Bromborough, Cheshire, England. Thomas arrived in Van Diemen's Land on 23 January 1828 followed by John and Peter with the rest of the family on 8 July 1831. Initially obtaining land on the west bank of the Tamar River, by December 1838 they also acquired land at Lake Purrumbete in Victoria where they bred sheep and cattle. On the death of the pioneer proprietors the estate, comprising 48,000 acres was divided into four - Purrumbete, Talindert, Wiridgil and Danedite for the next generation.

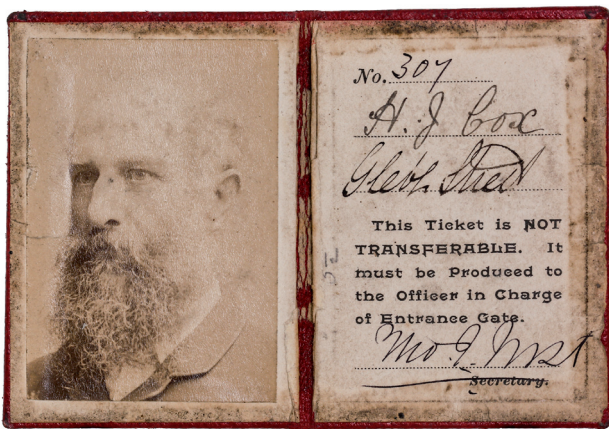

Malcolm George Douglas Murray, born 4 January 1887 in Adelaide, educated at St Peter's College Adelaide and Trinity College Cambridge. On returning to Adelaide in 1912 he became a farmer/grazier before enlisting on 3rd October 1917 in Adelaide, embarking from Sydney with the 9th Light Horse, 30th April 1918. He died of disease 25th October 1918 in Syria and was buried in the Damascus British War Cemetery.

T.B. Macfarlane of 'Cullingral' at Merriwa in the upper Hunter Valley of NSW alongside the Merriwa River. Cullingral was established in 1839 by Charles Blaxland, the son of explorer Gregory Blaxland who led the first successful crossing of the Blue Mountains by European settlers. In about the early 1930s it was acquired by T.B. Macfarlane who established a leading Corriedale sheep stud on the property. Mr Macfarlane was appointed a councillor of the Royal Agricultural Society of NSW in 1934 and then a vice-president. He was also a vice-president of the Australasian (Lincoln Merino) Corriedale Society.

Following the successful 1938 show, the RAS sent Councillor T.B. Macfarlane and Assistant Secretary A.V. Skidmore on a 15 week tour of North America to bring back ideas and secure new acts. The RAS as well as farmers had been severely affected by the Great Depression and in 1935 an American touring wild-west troupe was persuaded to perform and was a great success and performed in the following shows over the next few years. The horses for these shows were local horses acquired by Macfarlane and trained on his property at Merriwa for 6 weeks prior to each show. During Macfarlane and Skidmore's tour they searched for new entertainment, mainly equestrian, as well as promoting trade and tourism and publicised the activities of the RAS.

In 1939 the Governor, Lord Wakehurst stayed with Mr and Mrs T.B. Macfarlane at their station home, 'Cullingral' at Merriwa. In 1942 T.B. Macfarlane of Merriwa was appointed Chief Ranger to co-ordinate the evacuation of cattle from the coastal areas of northern New South Wales in the event of a wartime invasion.

One of the awards at the current RAS of NSW Sydney Royal Horse Show is The T B Macfarlane Perpetual Trophy, donated by the late T B Macfarlane, for the highest score in any session of the World Championship Campdraft Competition. The World Championship Campdraft is run in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of The Australian Bushmen's Campdraft & Rodeo Association Ltd.

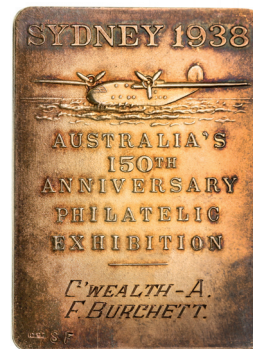
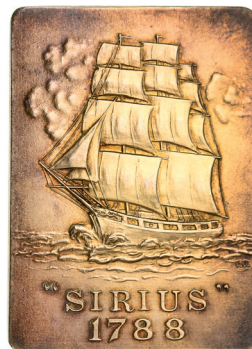

Mr Frost of Nerrina, a suburb of Ballarat in Victoria, was lowered on a rope down an 80ft disused mine shaft at Nerrina to rescue a small Australian terrier. The medal and framed citation were presented to him by Mr G.Sutton, President of the Victorian S.P.A. at the Ballarat Branch.

Constable Alomes thus made history by becoming the first Tasmanian Police officer to receive two awards at the same time for different acts of gallantry.

Hilton Frank Alomes served two years with Royal Australian Navy before joining the Tasmania Police Force on 12Aug1955; passed Senior Constable exam 17Nov1963; promoted to Senior Constable 23Dec1965; Authority dated 15Jun1966 granted to 'Demand Admittance to Licensed Houses'; passed Sergeant's exam 15Sep1966; transferred to Sergeant of the Watch at

Hobart Dec1970; passed Inspector examination 09Sep1971; transferred to New Norfolk 24Nov1971 and rank of Senior Sergeant; promoted to rank of Inspector 14Mar1974; transferred to St Marys 24Jun1974; transferred to Hobart (No 1 Division) 26Nov1975; appointed Justice of the Peace 11Oct1978; head of Hobart police division for 6 years before he retired 12Oct1983 and was former officer-in-charge of crime prevention in the state (appointed 05Aug1966) and during this time he wrote a regular newspaper column titled, 'Police Bear'; died 31Dec1986, suddenly, in Melbourne at age 61 and buried at Copping Cemetery, Copping, Tasmania after a service at All Saints' Anglican Church, South Hobart.
