FOREIGN COINS USED IN EARLY NEW ZEALAND

New Zealand utilised gifts and barter in its earliest forms of trading. Coinage was always in short supply and English coinage circulated to a very limited extent. The British coinage before 1840 consisted of a small number of guineas and half guineas, sovereigns and half sovereigns and these circulated together with 1787 shillings and sixpences which because of their high silver quality were melted down. Cartwheel copper issues of 1797 also circulated but because of their weight were difficult to carry. Consequently as white settlement became more itensive in New Zealand some other coins came into use. To this end Governor Hobson introduced the "Blue Book" in 1840 which were returns submitted to the House of Commons. Although from 1840 British gold, silver and

copper were assumed to be the legal coins of New Zealand there was also a variety of foreign coins that circulated and Govenor Hobson and successive Governors recognised them and officially listed their values in relation to sterling. Allan Sutherland "Numismatic History of New Zealand", (Wellington, 1941, from pages 70 - 94) listed and describe these coins and they included the coins of Spain and Spanish America, Latin American Republics, United States of America, France and India. The "Blue Book" records these issues and continued the listing of them to 1849. The relative values for various denominations and issues were noted in these returns and often the values of individual coins changed over this decade in relationship to sterling. The W.H. Lampard Collection of this series attempts to be as representative as possible of these emergency coins and these are described below as a collection of circulating coins of this era. Reference should be made to Sutherland's book for relative values of each coin at a particular time and for the complete listing.







Selby, Ernest Frank Captain 1st Battalion, Otago Regiment, (L.G. 16 August 1917, P.8397) For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. During an attack he showed the greatest personal courage in reorganising the whole of the line during a critical moment, supervising the work himself and ensuring the successful completion of the line against counter-attack. During the whole of this time the position was being heavily shelled. Selby, Ernest Frank Lieutenant (Temp. Captain), 1st Battalion, Otago regiment, (L.G. 1 June 1917, P.5429) Operations Somme - 20th September/4th October 1916. Recommended for meritorious service and devotion to duty all the time, and in particular during operations at Goose Alley (Somme) when 25th-27th September as 2nd Lieutenant, he was in charge of a strong point. Although the point was continually shelled by the enemy, and knocked about, Captain Selby held on and continued to repair it, in spite of heavy fire. He maintained the morale of his men under these adverse conditions, and was of great assistance throughout. On leaving the Somme he, although a junior officer, was given command of a company, in the control of which he has displayed conspicuous ability. He is an officer in whom I place the greatest reliance.

Selby, Harold Issac confimed on roll of NSW Imperial Bushmen. Mentioned in desptches (from Col. Benson's despatch on operations in Gatsrand, March 16 to April 4 1901) Imperial Bushmen (6th) -Pte. H. Selby caught and took a man's horse to him under close fire, and remained with him whilst he resaddled his horse, saddle having slipped round while he tried to mount.

Mckenzie, Norman Alexander, Sergeant, 1st Battalion, Auckland Regiment, M.M. For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. On the 1st October 1918 this N.C.O. did particularly gallant work in the attack on enemy positions east of Masnieres. He led his sections with fine dash against intense machine gun fire and was one of the first to enter the front line trench where he shot many of the enemy. Continuing further forward and to the right with three men he entered the enemy's second line which was very strongly held and defended with defence of machine guns. At great personal risk and quite unprotected he enfiladed their trench with rifle fire, and after killing about 15, fully 70 surrendered and the remainder ran away. Later in the same day during the enemy counter attack he did magnificent work under intense fire in organising the retirement of his men. He with two others remained behind in an advances position and covered the retirement with rifle fire. His work throughout the day was of a very high standard and the manner in which he commanded his men without thought of his own safety inspired all under his command to a remarkable degree. - London Gazette 13 March 1919, p3453, Rec No.2934.
