The design for this coinage was determined in 1740 and declared the standard pagoda of M adras 9th A pril 1741. Referred to in the Company's records as the ' $M$ adras current or star pagoda'. This is the coin type that A ndrews should have illustrated in his book for Governor King's proclamation of 1800, rather than an 1808 pagoda for M adras that was illustrated. Crellin uses the coin type as an illustration on his cover of his book "The Coinage of Colonial Australia, Governor King's Proclamation of 1800" . He devotes a chapter to this coin type (pp.63-69).
