The following courtesy of Palmerston North City Council, regarding the premises occupied by Pees Brothers at 19-21 Coleman Place - The Arcade:

"....The next known occupant of the building was the Nonpareil Cycle & Motor Co - the word 'Nonpareil' meaning 'a person or thing having no equal.' According to CT WN24/199, Eric Stanley Pees, co-owner of the Nonpareil Cycle & Motor Co, leased this building from 1 November 1911 until 29 April 1921 (the existing 15-year lease was set to end on 30 April 1921.

The Cyclopedia of New Zealand, Vol 6, published in 1908, provided a description of the firm. However, at the time Nonpareil occupied the neighbouring building on the western boundary of this building. The aforementioned article reads: "The Nonpareil Cycle and Motor Company (ES Pees and CS Pees): The Square, Palmerston North. Branch business at Wellington and Newtown.

This firm, which now stands well to the front in the Wellington province, was established in Ghuznee Street, Wellington, in the year 1902, and the Newtown branch was opened in 1905.

In November 1906, the firm bought out the retail cycle business of Messrs J.B.Clarkson and Company, Limited, of Palmerston North, and removed the headquarters of the firm to that town. The premises are amongst the

finest in the town; they have 2,000 square feet of floor space, are fitted up and appointed in the most up-to-date and attractive manner, and comprise a commodious showroom (capable of displaying 100 machines), a suite of offices, and large workrooms.

This firm make a fine display in their showrooms of the Nonpareil cycle (their own manufacture), also the Centaur and Premier cycles, for which they are agents. A large stock of accessories is kept, and repairing is also done on the premises; in which latter connection the firm have a good reputation for reliable and trustworthy workmanship.

The Wellington and Newtown branch shops are also spacious and up-to-date, and both carry a fine stock of bicycles, etc. The firm do an extensive trade in all parts of the North Island, and employ twenty-five persons. Agencies have been established in Foxton, Otaki, and Shannon."

The article also includes biographies on the owners, London-born brothers Eric Stanley Pees (born 1882) and Charles Sydney Pees (born 1880). E.S.Pees emigrated to New Zealand aged 16 (c1898), being joined by C.S.Pees, an engineering draftsman, in 1902. They established their business in Wellington in 1906, before acquiring the Palmerston North branch and turning it into their head office, with E.S.Pees moving to the town. C.S.Pees remained in Wellington, where he managed the Wellington branch.

The firm held its official opening in this building on the evening of 17 November 1911, during which, Mr E.S.Pees described their new and commodious brick business premises, as one of the largest (premises) of their kind in Australasia. In the course of the evening, the Mayor, Mr J.A.Nash, complimented Pees on acquiring such fine premises. The newspaper did not comment on Nash's former association with the building.

There is no corresponding entry on the CT for the other end of The Arcade, although that lease covers only the land (it was on a Borough Council reserve). The 1911-16 Wises Directories list other firms with links to J.A.Nash & Co as occupying that building. However, Nonpareil occupied it as part of what then became 7,500 square feet of showroom arcade, from mid-February 1914. The 1920-22 Directories state that Nonpareil Motor Co had its motor garage there.

The firm probably remained in this building until its lease ran out in 1921, and its departure marked the end of the two buildings being operated together as an arcade.







"Edward Wingfield Humphreys (1841 - April 1892) was a New Zealand member of parliament representing Christchurch North from 1889 to 1890. He was also a farmer in Otago, and his extended family included a number of political figures.

Humphreys was born in 1841 in Montgomeryshire, Wales. He was the second son of Erskine Humphrey, a barrister at law of Lincoln's Inn. He received his education at Harrow School, a boarding school in north-west London in the town of Harrow.

He emigrated to New Zealand and settled in the Strath Taieri district for farming. He purchased several areas of land (Six Mile, Garthmyl and Gladbrook), which were part of runs 213 and 213A.

He married Alice Humphreys (nee Hawdon), the second daughter of Hon. Joseph Hawdon MLC on 22 April 1869 at St John the Baptist Church in Christchurch. He thus became brother in law with Robert Campbell, who had married Hawdon's eldest daughter, Emma Josephine, on 2 December 1868 in Christchurch. Humphreys was also first cousin with Frederic Jones, who represented the Heathcote electorate from 1887 to 1890.

The resignation of Sir Julius Vogel caused the 19 June 1889 by-election in the Christchurch North electorate, contested by three candidates. Humphreys, John Ollivier and Eden George received 403, 378 and 184 votes, respectively. Ollivier had prior political experience, representing Christchurch Country in the 2nd New Zealand Parliament. Prior to that, he was the 2nd chairman of the Christchurch Town Council, a role that became that of Mayor of Christchurch a few years later. For Humphreys, who was relatively new to Christchurch, to beat such a well known person with political experience showed how well regarded he had become in a short period of time.

The electorates in Christchurch were reorganised for the 5 December 1890 general election. Christchurch North was abolished, and City of Christchurch

was set up as a three-member electorate. Humphreys decided to contest this electorate, and the six contenders received the following votes: William Pember Reeves (2774 - elected), Westby Perceval (2721 - elected), Richard Molesworth Taylor (2613 - elected), J.Tippett Smith (1811), Humphreys (1668) and Eden George (119).

Charles Gray was elected as Mayor of Christchurch a few days prior to the general election, and his seat in the North-West ward of the Christchurch City Council became vacant. Humphreys declared his candidacy for the city council ward on 10 December. Whilst Humphreys and W.I.Ballinger were nominated on 15 December for the 30 December election, Ballinger withdrew and Humphreys took his seat at the 23 December 1890 council meeting. He retained his seat on the city council until he left for England in September 1891.

Humphreys returned to England as he had cancer, and he was given the advice that better specialist medical knowledge was available in his old country. A leaving party was organised for him by the Cambrian Society on 1 September 1891, which had a large attendance. Humphreys died from cancer in London in April 1892. The Humphreys had no children. He was survived by his wife, who married again in England in 1896."

Wellington had not hosted a major industrial exhibition since 1895 and, in 1930, the mayor, Sir George Troup, began a campaign for the city to hold a centennial exhibition. The depression intervened but his successor, Thomas Hislop, revived the idea and led a deputation to Rt Hon M.J. Savage in January 1936 to ask the government's support. The Prime Minister's discussion with the deputation focused his attention on the centennial and in May the government made a policy statement that included its willingness to give financial support for a centennial exhibition. This would take the form of a grant of up to £50,000 (initially on the basis of one pound for every two pounds' worth of shares sold) and a loan of £25,000. This would be nearly one third of the £250,000 of the government's budget for the centennial celebrations.

The Centennial Exhibition fell short of Dunedin's in that it could not claim the coveted 'international' status. Before 1928 no rules had governed the running of international exhibitions. As these events grew in frequency, cost and political significance the need for minimum standards and sensible scheduling arrangements became obvious. In November 1928, therefore, many nations signed a convention on the use of the term 'international' for exhibitions. Signatories could not attend 'international' exhibitions not endorsed by the Paris secretariat. New Zealand was not a signatory, but Australia, Canada and Britain were, so the New Zealand High Commissioner urged caution in August 1937 when the Wellington company directors began talking about their exhibition as 'international'. The word 'empire' was acceptable, but J. W. Heenan, undersecretary of the Department of Internal Affairs, preferred the title the 'New Zealand Centennial Exhibition'. The New Zealand High Commissioner to London helped to secure the King's consent to act as Patron (the Prime Minister served as Vice-Patron and the Minister of Industries & Commerce as Honorary President).

The Wellington promoters followed the Dunedin model and formed a limited liability company to organise the exhibition, the New Zealand Centennial Exhibition Company Ltd (the exhibition company). Its articles of association provided for up to fifteen directors, one to be nominated by the Wellington City Council (WCC), three by central government and the remainder to be appointed by shareholders.



"Featherston Camp was the largest of the military camps in New Zealand where reinforcements for the New Zealand Expeditionary Force trained during the First World War. Most army personnel trained at Trentham Camp from October 1914 until July 1915, when the Defence Department revised its training arrangements. From January 1916 Trentham and Featherston camps shared the bulk of New Zealand's training needs, with Maori and Pacific Island troops based at Narrow Neck Camp in Auckland and medical reinforcements at Awapuni Camp in Palmerston North. Featherston Camp, together with its satellite camps at Tauherenikau and Papawai, could accommodate 9850 men in huts and tents. Its campsites and training grounds collectively covered 1861 acres (753 ha) of land in the Featherston-Greytown area.

Around 60,000 New Zealand military personnel who subsequently served overseas spent time at Featherston Camp, about two-thirds of the total. The government used the camp as a military hospital and German prisoner of war camp during 1919, and then as an ordnance depot until 1927. The army built a new Japanese prisoner of war camp there in 1942, which was closed in 1945.

Canteen & Shops

The men could buy extra food and other goods at the camp canteen with their weekly allowance of 4s (\$20-\$25). At 208 feet (63.4 m) long by 52 feet (15.8 m) wide, the canteen was one of the camp's largest and most conspicuous buildings. Stanbrook noted: 'At the canteen the soldier is able to buy clothing, toilet requisites, fruit, soft drinks, all kinds of tinned goods, cigarettes and various tobaccos, stationery, hot tea and coffee, cakes and meat pies - in short, the canteen has nearly everything for the man who has money to spend. An on-site bakery provided fresh food. One thing the canteen could not sell was alcohol. From February 1915 it was illegal to sell alcohol to soldiers in uniform except to drink on the premises where they were sold, and from November 1915 it was illegal for anyone to possess alcohol on the grounds of a military camp. The Defence Department initially contracted private operators to run the canteen, but cancelled the contract early in 1918 so that it could be run by C2 men (those classified medically unfit for military service) on behalf of the Department. This both lowered prices for the soldier and generated some income for the Department.

The Department also allowed private businesses to operate in the grounds of the camp. The shopkeepers paid both rent and trading rights to the Department, and opened at times prescribed by the camp authorities (7-8.30 a.m., 12-1.30 p.m. and 4.30-9.30 p.m. on weekdays; 12-9.30 p.m. on Saturdays). This arrangement provided basic services to the recruits and also helped meet the huge costs of operating a military camp. By May 1916 the shopkeepers at Trentham and Featherston camps had collectively paid the Department £20,750 (equivalent to more than \$2.6 million in 2010) in rent and trading rights. The shops at Featherston included military outfitters, bootmakers, a laundromat, baths, a watchmaker and jeweller, a hairdresser, a bowling alley, and a recreational indoor rifle range.

The camp closed in 1927.

The government reoccupied the site of the main Featherston Camp in September 1942 for use as a prisoner of war camp for Japanese work crews and military personnel who had been captured by American forces at Guadalcanal in the Solomon Islands. These men were housed in wooden barracks buildings constructed on top of the concrete remains of the First World War camp. The perimeter was secured by high barbedwire fences. An incident at the camp on 25 February 1943 culminated in the deaths of 48 prisoners and a guard. The surviving prisoners embarked for the Japanese port of Yokohama on 30 December 1945."


