The find of early electrum as a foundation deposit in the earliest temple at Ephesus included numerous third staters of this type. It also contained some inscribed electrum coins with the non-Greek name 'Welwet'. Scholars began identifying this name with Alyattes, king of Lydia. Since then this attribution has been thrown into doubt by the more recent discovery of a parallel name, 'Kagi', which does not correspond to any known Lydian king. No one really doubts, however that this prolific coinage was issued by the Lydian royal house. The lion's head was the dynastic badge, and this manner of representation, with the herringbone mane and 'wart' on nose, was introduced into Greek art from Assyria in the second half of the seventh century B.C. It is one of, if not the earliest example of ancient coinage that utilises a design of some type on the obverse. This example is better than most for it is well centred, and free of banker's marks common on this series.

On the Mediterranean, the city of Marathos (Amrit) lay under the dominion of Arados (Arwad). Both surrendered in about 332 BC to Alexander the Great, whose gold stater this type most clearly imitates. Until fairly recently it has been traditionally assigned to the beginning of Marathos coinage as the type was only known from the Paris de Luynes coin and the Houghton published example. The discovery of some Marathos drachms with a group of coins of Seleukos II has brought the known number up to a handful or so, while it has brought the likely issuance date down to c.230-225 B.C. This

new evidence is helpful, but the issue still remains much an enigma. There is an extremely rare tetradrachm, bearing the ethnic, from this period, and it may be that these drachms served as an auxiliary fractional coinage. In about 219 B.C., Marathos gained its independence from Arados and perhaps at this time these events lead to this coinage. In 148 B.C., Arados sacked the city, and Marathos was abandoned soon afterwards.

His surrender of Babylon without resistance probably induced Alexander to appoint him Satrap of Babylon (Alexander was honouring a worthy opponent). His unique position allowed him to issue a new coinage in his name at Babylon. The issue was based on the Attic weight standard (17 g not 10.8 g of the Cilician issue). This soon evolved into the regular coinage of Alexander the Great - that of his most prolific mint, Babylon. The issue and its significance is discussed by Bellinger, Alfred R., *Essays on the Coinage of Alexander the Great*, (NS No.11), New York, 1963, on pages 56ff., and particularly on pp.60-63. Bellinger sees this coinage as extremely important and as the precursor to the new 'national' coinage at the empire's new capital. Imhoof-Blumer's explanation is that 'Alexander's effort to make the utmost tolerance for the oriental point of view is well known. For the silver, the types of the Cilician satrapal issues of Mazaeus, Baaltars in the guise of Zeus and the lion were retained. On the first silver issue struck at Babylon, Mazaeus continued not only the coin types of the Cilician satrapy, but also the inscriptions, which promulgate the figure of Baaltars still little known in the far east'. Very soon after the issue of this rare coinage Mazaeus was induced to give up these inscriptions.

The heavy issue of this type is many more times rarer than the lighter version of about 15 grams. This rarer intermediate issue follows the modified Alexander the Great tetradrachms that substituted the head of Herakles with the head of Alexander with the scalp of an Indian elephant. This short series was replaced by a new distinctive issue showing a fighting Athena in archaising style hurling a thunderbolt and holding a shield with a weight standard of 17.2 grams. The next issue was a dramatic change in weight to 15.6 grams. This was necessitated by Ptolemy I's financial difficulties and his loss of Syria and Phoenicia to Antigonos I in 312 B.C. It meant abandoning the Attic standard (tetradrachm of 17.2 grams), and replacing it with the Rhodian or Chian standard (tetradrachm of 15.6 grams). This change took place about 312 B.C., at about the time when Alexander IV was murdered by Cassander and it had become no longer necessary for Ptolemy I to retain the same weight system. Zervos in his doctoral thesis records only 63 examples of this variety struck on the heavy standard; a comprehensive record of all known coins from the various museums, sale catalogues and lists.



The recipient of the above main document was an officer in the Dragons of Enghien of the Corps of Conde. Louis de Bourbon Conde, Duke of Enghien was a rallying point for the overthrow of the French government. He indicated his desire to work under the British flag and called the French 'his most cruel enemy'. William Wickham had set up spy networks and was advising d'Enghien on the developments of his counter revolution schemes and the two maintained written communications in their efforts to overthrow the French Government. It is understandable that the document issued by William Wickham should afford the recipient protection because officers in the Army of Conde had been threatened with 'nothing better than the rope and the sword' if they entered France.

William Wickham, Spymaster, has had numerous books written about his role in trying to bring down the French revolutionary government and restore the Bourbons to rule France. Wickham was born at Cottingsley, Yorkshire, England on 11 November 1761 into a well-to-do family. After completing his schooling at Harrow and Christ Church he studied for a law degree at Geneva, Switzerland, graduating in 1786. In 1788 he married a Swiss citizen, Eleonora Madeleine Bertrand, whose father was professor of mathematics at the University of Geneva. He then entered the British diplomatic service and because of his familiarity with Switzerland he was sent there in 1794 as assistant to the British Ambassador and one year later was promoted to that position.

As the Ambassador to Switzerland his primary role was that of spymaster and he established a network in Switzerland and France with the object of planning invasions of France by French Royalists or any other foreign powers that might be able to restore the French monarchy of Louis XVIII who was living in exile.

To achieve his goals, the British Government endowed Wickham with an enormous amount of money, much of this directed to the revolutionary French General Charles Pichegru whom Wickham was trying to woo over so that all of his troops could be placed into the ranks of Louis Joseph, Prince of Conde who maintained an army on the Rhine. When French spies learned of Wickham's spy network France pressured the Swiss Government to remove him so Wickham resigned and returned to England where he was appointed Under-Secretary of State for the Home Department in 1798. However, he returned to Switzerland in 1799 and resumed his spy network for another three years, this time against Emperor Napoleon I. Pressure was once more placed on the Swiss Government so again Wickham resigned and this time returned to England for good.

In 1802 he was appointed to the Privy Council and named Chief Secretary for Ireland, a post he held until 1804. He also served terms as a Member of Parliament from 1802 to 1807. He died on 22 October 1840.






