Sir Samuel Wilson (1832-1895) pastoralist and politician. Established a Wimmera run in 1852 and also had some success at the goldfields. He bought Longerenong Station at the junction of the Wimmera River and Yarriambiak Creek. Wilson supported the work of the Acclimatisation Society by experimenting with ostrich farming and breeding angora goats. He acquired many other properties, including Ercildoune Stud. He represented Wimmera in the Legislative Assembly 1861-64. He gave £30,000 to build a hall at Melbourne University. Wilson was President of the National Agricultural Society of Victoria in 1873 and was knighted in 1875. Later he retired to England.

Sir Thomas Buckland (1848-1947) was a gold-mine manager, pastoralist, businessman and philanthropist. Born in England, he migrated to Victoria where he became a gold assayer. In 1872 he moved to Charters Towers in Queensland where he set up as a gold-buyer and assayer. He invested heavily in mining and was managing director of the most productive goldmine in Australasia, the Victory (Charters Towers) Gold Mining Co Ltd. In 1877 he was a member of the Charters Towers Municipal Council and was mayor in 1882 and 1883. He was also on other committees and associations and had a distinguished business career in Queensland and New South Wales and was a noted philanthropist. He was knighted in June 1935.

The Zeehan School of Mines and Metallurgy was established in 1892 during the mining boom following the discovery of tin, silver and lead at the remote town that at one time was Tasmania's second largest town and was known as Silver City. The school operated out of impressive premises in Main Street, Zeehan but by 1921 it became part-time following the decline of the mines and it closed in 1958.
