"THE LATE CHAMPION RIFLE SHOOTING

(From the Wellington Independent.)

The ex-champion Christie and Sergeant W.Taylor (of No.2 Company Dunedin Scottish Rifles) were ties at 47. These two had consequently to shoot off, and accompanied by a large crowd were marched down to the 400 yards range, where the question of who was to be the champion for the year would be settled by one shot. Intense was the excitement, breathless the anxiety when the former, after a short pause, lay down and brought his rifle to the present. A steady glance at the target, a moment's pause, a flash, and then the blue flag showed that a centre was the result of Christie's aim. Taylor then came to the front and coolly lay down and fired. In a moment a bull's eye was shown at the butts, and with, loud cheers the Champion for 1868 was greeted as he rose to his feet.

The very interesting ceremony of distributing the prizes to the successful competitors took place in front of the Houses of Parliament, at noon, on Wednesday, April 29. The weather was fine, and some 300 or 400 people, including a number of ladies, assembled to witness the ceremony. At the appointed hour, Mrs. Stafford, accompanied by the Hons. Col. Haultain and Major Richardson, approached the table, and addressing the volunteers, read the following speech, in a low tone of voice, inaudible within a few feet of where she was standing:-

'Volunteers:-It is with very great pleasure that I avail myself, once more, of the opportunity which is afforded me of delivering to the successful competitors the prizes which the Government of the Colony have been enabled to set apart for the encouragement of marksmen in the use of the rifle. As the bowmen of our native land were well known among their foes, some centuries since, by the strength of their arm, the accuracy of their aim, and the dauntless character of their courage, so, I feel assured, that in all time to come, the riflemen of Great Britain, and of her colonies, will be equally well known whenever there shall be a call upon their loyalty and patriotism to rally around the throne and their country; and that then the crack of their rifles will be as sure an earnest of victory as were the clouds of arrows which were showered forth from out the ranks of the sturdy yeomen of old. It is with no little pleasure that I have learned that there is a decided improvement, both in the firing for the competitive representation in the provinces, and the firing for the colonial prizes which has just been concluded. I hope the time is not far distant when we shall have to welcome home some marksman of our own who will bear with him from a colonial or international contest, some badge of victory which will tell that the sons of New Zealand are emulous of distinction far beyond the narrow limits of their own shores, I recognise with much gratification, one particular in which this occasion differs from the two which have preceded it. I see in your ranks the first fruits of the future defenders of New Zealand. Our cadet companies have taken their place as a recognised part of the volunteer system, and it will, doubtless, not be long from what I hear, before some youthful aspirant will become noted among the marksmen of the day, and make those who are now competing, look well to their laurels. Volunteers, if I may be allowed to speak on behalf of the women of New Zealand, I will tell you that it is with a peculiar pride that the mothers and daughters of our adopted country see those dearest to them hasten to join your ranks, and by regularity of attendance and unremitting attention, calling into existence those combined qualities which characterize the British soldier, and have added lustre to those glorious deeds of arms which have been exhibited by him on many a well-fought field. You know too well the sad cause which has prevented your receiving at the hands of his Royal Highness the Duke of Edinburgh those prizes which I am now about to distribute. We mourn his absence is the abscence of one who, on his return to our native land, could have told to his widowed mother, our gracious and well-beloved Queen, that the youngest of the dependencies of the British Crown cherished, as a sacred possession, as true a devotion and as deeprooted loyalty as any portion of her Majesty's dominions. We mourn his absence, but we grieve still more that there could be found a British subject who could have done such a dastard's deed. Yet still our grief is somewhat allayed when we hear from every quarter the fervent outpourings of loyalty to the Queen, and we see the rapid expansion of the volunteer movement, indicating, by no uncertain sign, that come what may, New Zealand shall be known as among the truest and most devoted of the subjects of the British Crown.'

The Duke of Edinburgh's non appearance at the ceremony was ocassioned by the fact he was shot and seriously wounded in Sydney while on a Royal Visit to Australia. The tour was originally planned to end in New Zealand. The perpetrator was hanged. The Duke finally arrived in New Zealand in April 1869, the first of three official visits to occur between 1869 and 1870.

'Volunteer Prize Firing - Artillery Volunteers - Class & Company Firing - The members of the Artillery Volunteers yesterday proceeded to the butts, Point Chevalier, for the purpose of competing for a number of prizes as mentioned below. The day was somewhat boisterous, the wind blowing strongly the whole day from the south-west, with occasional showers of rain. The following are the prizes which were competed for, with the names of the winners: - 1st Prize, the Prize Belt. presented by Gunner Dent, with £2 added, won by Gunner Davies; 2nd prize, gold-mounted greenstone sword, gift of E.H.Lewisson, value £5, Gunner Alderton; 3rd prize, full prize, full prize, gold-mounted greenstone sword, gift of E.H.Lewisson, value £5, Gunner Alderton; 3rd prize, £1 10s, Gunner Harrison; 6th prize, £1, won by Bombadier Payne; 7th prize, 15s, Gunner Skinner. The firing party was in charge of Lieutenant Powley. Captain Featon and the band arrived on the ground about 12 o'clock. The ranges were 150, 200, and 250 yards. The corps passed a vote of thanks to the public for the handsome manner in which they came forward with their subscriptions on this occasion. There was a good substantial lunch provided, and about 42 members of the corps were present.'

The firing for the Champion Cross, presented by Captain Porter and Lieut. Diviani, to the Pokeno Rangers Rifle Volunteer Company, came off on Saturday last, the distances being 300, 400, 500 and 600 yards; five shots at each range; no trial shot. Some good shooting was made by some of the young men, Corporal M.Gallery and Volunteer T.McGinity keeping very close together. At the 600 yards Gallery passed McGinity, and became the winner of the Cross by two points. It is a very handsome silver Cross made by Mr Schwartze, of Auckland, to whom great credit is due for the workmanlike manner in which he turned it out. After the firing the Company paraded for their monthly inspection by Major Lusk, and the district prize money was paid. The Pokeno Rangers took five prizes - two for the Company and three to the Cadets. After parade Captain Porter paid the capitation to both men and Cadets.

These medals spanning nearly 50 years, were won by a member of the well known family, Ballinger.

The oldest sports trophy in New Zealand is the famous Ballinger Belt, the symbol of the utmost prowess in rifle shooting. A Wellington family, the Ballingers, were among the prime movers in the formation of the Petone Rifle Club, and foundation members. From 1879 to 1907 the N.Z. Rifle Championship was won by one or other of two brothers Ballinger on five occasions. In 1873 the Government donated for annual competition a black leather belt with a silver-ornamented cartridge pouch supported by a shoulder strap.

It was won in 1893 by Arthur Ballinger who won it twice more, the third occasion in 1907 when, under the rules, he was entitled to retain it. The belt was then thirty-four years old, already a venerable trophy. Arthur donated it to the National Rifle Association for perpetual competition.

As the 'Ballinger Belt' it has been put around the shoulders of every National Champion to this day. The Ballingers were keen supporters of the Volunteer Forces. Whilst Arthur's wins in 1893 and 1897 occurred during his membership of the Wellington Guards he was at that time an active member of the Petone Rifle Club.

On 24 March 1913, Myrtle Wood, with several other girls, was bathing close to the channel at Greymouth (sic), when herself and one of the party, Annie Clark, finding themselves out of their depths, clutched hold of each other and both girls sank. Alan Leonard, 13, who was on the bank, grasping the situation, sprang into the water and swam to the girls' assistance. He reached them as they sank for the second time, and after much difficulty, succeeded in getting them ashore. Had it not been for the plucky action of this boy, both girls would have been drowned."

An article in the Auckland Star at the time (26 March 1913) reported as follows. The report is in conflict with the Royal Humane Society citation above (courtesy National Library of New Zealand - Papers Past):

"RESCUED FROM DROWNING.

LAD'S PLUCKY ACT,

A somewhat sensational incident occurred on Easter Monday at Weymouth Beach, which is situated on the Manukau Harbour about three miles from Manurewa, The Papakura Anglican Church was holding a picnic there, and about noon, when a number of the young people were bathing, Miss Woods, daughter of the vicar, had the misfortune to slip off a ledge of rock into deep water, and was soon seen to be in difficulties. There were between thirty and forty people on the beach at the time, but to a lad who reached the age of 13 last December is due the honour of having rescued the young lady, who is about 17 years old. Alan Leonard (son of Mr. T.H.Leonard) saw the dangerous plight of Miss Wood, and he at once swam out to her assistance. Getting hold of her hair he began to bring her to the shore. Miss Wood, as most people do when in difficulties in the water, tried to get hold of the lad, but he, having been taught life-saving, had the good sense to keep her head under water, and thus managed to reach the shore safely, where ready assistance was waiting to mitigate any dangers from the sudden immersion. The Rev. Woods wanted to make a presentation to the lad for saving his daughter, but this was courteously declined by Mr. Leonard, who said that his son required no reward for simply doing what was the duty of everyone, namely, to rescue another when in danger.

On 16 November, 1913, a heavy and treacherous sea was running at the time, Mr J.E.Packman, 35, ventured into the water at Napier, and when he tried to return he found he was unable to do so owing to the strong backwash, and realising his danger he called for help. Alan Stevenson, 16, who was on the beach at the time, immediately went to his assistance, and after considerable exertion and a hard struggle through the surf reached Packman, and held him up, as it was quite impossible for him to attempt to gain the shore with Mr Packman, so called for help, and so attracted the attention of his brother Ken Stevenson, who immediately obtained the use of the surf-reel which was handy, and relieved him of his burden.

"On the afternoon of 15 July 1915, Thomas James Stevenson, about 30, while apparently in a depressed state, walked into the sea off the Marine Parade Beach, Napier. An elderly man, Robert Lynam, was going in after him, but was prevented owing to the heavy sea running at the time. He then went to the Vulcan Foundry and raised the alarm.

John Dighton, 20, had come home from Napier Boys' High School and changed into football clothes when he heard there was a man in the surf. He ran to the beach, took off his boots and jersey, dived through the surf, and swam out to Stevenson, who was now lying face down in the water. He turned him over on his back and began towing him towards the shore. A big sea came up and he lost the body and it sank. He got the body again; with his legs cramped and becoming stiff, he had to let the body go. He then signalled the beach for help.

Meanwhile, Henry Evetts, a blacksmith's striker at the Vulcan Foundry, on hearing the alarm ran to the beach, took off his boots, and put on a lifebelt, having asked Robert Lynam to haul it off the reel for him. He then rushed into the surf, and although knocked back twice by the breakers, managed to get out. He swam 80 yards or so to Dighton, then to the body, a further 30 yards out. Evetts then signalled the shore to haul in. With Dighton also gripping the line, they were towed right in and the body was taken by others. Artificial resucitation was tried, but the man was dead. Robert Lynam, who had been awarded medals himself for earlier rescues, later said "I think it was very brave of Dighton going out. He was 8 to 10 minutes in the water. I know the beach well and know Dighton had a great risk. Dighton was exhausted when he came ashore, so was Evetts."

"SAVING OF LIFE - ROYAL HUMANE SOCIETY'S HONOURS.

After presentations at the Napier Drill Hall on Saturday night, his Worship the Mayor (Mr.J.V.Brown, M.P.) took occasion to present to three Napier men awards from the Royal Humane Society. The first called to receive recognition was Mr.J.Dighton. His Worship said that he had much pleasure in presenting the awards. It was very pleasing to be able to say that a great number of medals came to Napier. He would like to refer to the record held by Mr.J.Knowles who had just returned wounded from the Dardanelles. Mr. Knowles had saved 14 lives, and had received every award it was possible to get. All through New Zealand swimmers had gone to the front. Mr. Dighton was getting the highest honour that could be conferred in this country. He hoped he might live long and save many more lives. He would present Mr. Dighton with a gold medallion and framed certificate for attempting to save the life of a man named Stevenson, who was drowned off the Marine Parade on December 10th.

The next to be invited to step forward was Mr. H.Evetts, who helped Mr. Dighton in his work of rescue. His Worship, in presenting the certificate, congratulated Mr. Evetts on behalf of the people of Hawke's Bay and New Zealand on his efforts to help his friend.

Mr. A.Robertson was then presented with a bronze medallion and certificate for attempting to save Miss Millar, who was drowned in a very rough sea off the Marine Parade. His Worship said that the sea was one of the roughest ever seen in Napier. Miss Millar had got out of her depth, and Mr. Robertson had bravely tried to rescue her. Some people would not think so much of a man who tried but failed to rescue a person, as they would of a man who succeeded. However, he thought a man who tried to save a life was just as brave as a man who had saved half a dozen.

As each man was presented with the award he received three enthusiastic cheers from those present."

Until the end of 1998 only 11 of the Type 2 gold medal (1915-) had been awarded. Six awards of the Type 1 gold medal were made between 1898 and 1914

'Returning from a fishing trip in Cook Strait on the afternoon of Tuesday 30 September 1930, the launch 'Crescent', carrying four men, broke down and drifted helplessly in heavy seas for several hours. By saturating their clothing in benzine and burning it bit by bit, the launch crew eventually attracted the attention of fishermen at Island Bay, Wellington. Several attemps to reach the launch failed, and the vessel was eventually driven on to rocks near Owhiro Bay, Wellington, where she was smashed to pieces. The skipper, Arthur John Heberley, instead of swimming ashore to safety, stayed behind in an attempt to save Magnus Hunter, who could not swim. Both men drowned, as did James George Augustus Perano, who disappeared when the 'Crescent' broke up. The fourth fisherman, Arthur James Hodgman was cast upon a rock some distance from the shore.

Laurence Johnson, 21, Peter Isbister, 38 and Arthur Pottinger, 39, assisted in rescuing Mr Hodgman. The three men secured a rope around each other and at the risk of their lives jumped into a raging sea. Mr Isbister made several attempts to reach Hodgman and finally succeeded and held him up until his companions came to his assistance, and with the assistance of those on shore they succeeded in effecting a rescue.

On the evening of 26 December 1933, a party of bathers were caught by the undertow at Wainui Beach, Gisborne. Jack Beckett, 18, who had been with them, scrambled up the sand-hills to raise the alarm, and with others rushed back to the surf. After a struggle, he brought Miss Lois Matthews, 15, ashore. Although exhausted by this rescue, he continued giving aid in getting the other endangered swimmers ashore.

Robert Sloan, 32, in a passing car, was stopped and asked for help. He rushed to the shore, undressed, and swam beyond the line of the surf to Ralph H.Matthews, 20, and Misses Yvonne L.Harris, 19, and Lorraine E.Harris, 17. Sloan realised that their best chance of getting ashore was to save effort. Helping Matthews to calm the ladies' fears, and assisting each girl in turn, he got them to a point where the undertow was less. Then, in a battle with the surf, they fought their way to where willing hands grasped them and helped them on to solid footing. Although a powerful swimmer, Sloan's efforts in the water lasted half an hour and he was absolutely exhausted by the time he had completed the rescue. He risked his life to save the lives of others. Bravery Deed: In the early evening of 21 November 1981 Mark Bruce Thompson went down to the Boat Harbour at Mahanga Beach, Mahia, Hawkes Bay, to do some repairs to his fishing boat. He noticed two men clinging to an upturned aluminium dinghy about 100 metres off shore. Since it was low tide it was impossible to launch a large vessel, so Thompson rowed out to them in a small plywood dinghy. By the time he reached them they were cold and almost exhausted, but he managed to drag them from the water. The combined weight of the three men, together with a strong surf and heavy breakers made it dangerous for Thompson to attempt to return to shore. He therefore waited beyond the breaker line for as long as he could. When darkness began to close in and when the two men began to show signs of hypothermia Thompson had no choice but to try to make for the beach. The small boat was quickly swamped by the heavy waves and the three men were thrown into the water. Thompson concentrated his efforts now on helping the non-swimmer of the two and despite the latter's panicking he was able to bring him to shore. He then tried to locate the second man but was unable to do so, and in fact his body was never found. The weather at the time was cold, with a brisk wind blowing, and the water temperature was low. Thompson displayed a high degree of determination throughout the rescue attempt and undoubtedly saved one life.
