

TOKENS OF HONOUR, RETURNED & OTHER SOLDIERS

Tokens of Honour or 'Tribute Fobs' - Usually handcrafted in gold by local New Zealand jewellers, these fob medals were presented mostly to returning soldiers by local Patriotic Committees of small New Zealand towns. Sometimes departure fobs were given and the occasional 'Memorial' fob was presented to families of war casualties. They were usually presented at a town function such as a civic reception or dinner and the events were normally reported in the local newspapers. The practice began after troops returned from the South African War around 1902 and was widespread by the end of WWI. By WWII the patriotism had waned (and probably the money) and only small numbers were presented. In WWI provinces in the south of the South Island seemed to be very prolific with the presentation of these awards, perhaps showing more patriotism (or more gratitude to those who served) than those in the North Island and upper South Island. Only a few from small pockets in the North Island are in the collection. Apart from a private presentation piece from Dunedin, no tribute fobs have been noted from any of the major cities, except one to a nurse from One Tree Hill, Auckland. Boer War tribute fobs are extremely rare and WWII fobs are seldom seen. The role of Patriotic Committees and their funding make interesting reading - see NZETC - 'War Relief and Patriotic Societies' by L.O.H.Tripp, published in 1923. This collection of unique 'Tokens of Honour' has been built up by the owner over a period of some 45 years and is a splendid record of the regard shown for those who served their country, especially in the Great War of 1914-18.

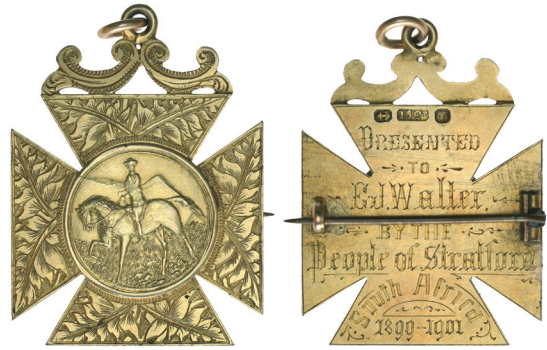

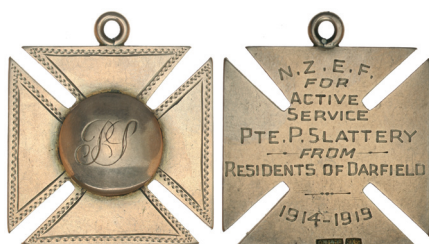

"WELCOME TO SOLDIERS - WORKERS FROM FAIRFIELD

A welcome home was accorded to a number of returned soldiers by the butchers and assistants of the Fairfield Freezing works on Saturday evening in the Theatre Royal. Mr W.Phelan, foreman of works, presided.

In proposing the toast of the "Returned Soldiers" Mr Phelan paid a tribute to those who had served in the war. Mr J.Johnson responded. The toast of "Our Guests" was proposed by the chairman, who said that the slaughtering department was extremely proud of the part its men had taken in the great war, 25 in all having enlisted from that branch of the Works.

Some had, unfortunately, "gone west," but those assembled were pleased to extend a hearty welcome to their comrades, who had come through safe and sound.

The chairman explained that this function was similar to several others that had been held to welcome home members who had returned earlier.

On these occasions medals had been presented to the men, and on behalf of those present he asked the "Guests" to accept a gold medal bearing the monogram F.S.A. (Fairfield slaughtermen and assistants).

Mr Phelan presented the medals to Messrs J.F.Hume, D.M.McKay, N.S.Hume, T.R.S. Scott, R.Macklan, W.Quinn, J.Murray, H.Hill, R.Harris and R.Bremner.

The recipients suitably responded. Several other toasts were honoured and in the course of the evening instrumental and vocal items were contributed by Messrs S.Scott, R.Harrison, C.Campbell, J.Thomas, W.Drennen and T.Minogue."

The tribute fob to R.Bremner from the Fairton/Fairfield Slaughtermen & Assistants, is being attributed to W.R.Bremner (listed in lot as Private W.R.Breniner). It would appear that in 1920 there was a large meat freezing works at Fairton, which adjoined Fairfield, 4 miles to the north-east.

"Adam Rae McNeilly was from Lawrence, Otago. Adam was an excellent student. In his last year at Lawrence District High School, he was dux and won awards in English, Arithmetic, and Composition.

In 1909, Adam won Junior Honours in the Trinity School of Music examinations. In the same year, he passed the Junior Civil Service Examination and was offered a cadetship with the Inspection of Machinery Department.

In April 1909, instead of becoming an inspector of machinery, Adam joined the Audit Department. By the outbreak of WW1, he had attained the position of Audit Examiner, Class VII, and had passed the Senior Civil Service Examination.

Adam joined the New Zealand Expeditionary Force (Medical Corps) when he was 21. In August 1914, he was sent to Samoa as part of the Samoan Advance Party. In April 1915, after returning from Samoa, he resigned from the New Zealand Expeditionary Force and resumed work for the Audit Department.

In September 1915, he was medically assessed for military service and was declared "unfit - defective vision". Despite this, Adam was allowed to rejoin the New Zealand Expeditionary Force in February 1917.

In July 1917, he was promoted to Corporal and, in February 1918, to Sergeant. In March 1918, he was posted overseas but was hospitalised in Suez with measles. In May 1918, after recovering, he was sent to Britain.

In September 1918, Adam went to France with the 2nd Battalion, Wellington Infantry Regiment. His military file records that he was "marched into field", which meant that he took part in the fighting on the Western Front towards the end of WW1 that successfully forced the Germans to retreat to Germany.

The 2nd Battalion took part in several battles, including the battle to free the town of Le Quesnoy. Le Quesnoy is a medieval town that had been occupied by about 1000 German troops since the start of the war. The town was protected by a 12-metre-high ancient, thick, rampart made of earth faced with brick and topped with undergrowth and trees. A 100-metre-wide moat lay between the ramparts and an outer mound of earth. Thousands of French people remained in the town. German troops held strategic positions around Le Quesnoy. The town, which was next to a rail junction, was seen to be of strategic importance and had to be recaptured. It was the job of New Zealand troops to capture the town. The New Zealanders decided not to use artillery to attack the town to force the German troops out, as this would mean the death of French people and destruction of the town.

The New Zealand battle plan called for Le Quesnoy to be encircled, which first required German positions outside the town to be attacked. After heavy fighting, these positions were overrun. By noon, the New Zealanders had secured the outer mound and surrounded the town. The next stage of the plan was daring.

The New Zealanders had to find a way over the wide moat and then over the ancient ramparts.

The New Zealand plan was to build cork floats to cross the moat and to then prop long ladders against the ramparts and climb over. When this plan was first discussed, one of the officers recalls scoffing at the idea and asking for a copy of Ivanhoe so he could study this ancient method of assault.

The ladders were built, although all but one ladder was later destroyed by shelling from German artillery within the town. No way could be found to get over the ramparts until a brickwork sluice gate was discovered which crossed the moat on the western side of the town. Under cover from machine guns and after firing drums of burning oil onto the ramparts - which spread fire and smoke and caused the defenders to retreat - the remaining ladder was propped up on the brick sluice gate and climbed by the New Zealanders. Troops then made their way up the ladder, but on reaching the top soon came under heavy fire. However, the New Zealand troops overcame this resistance and, soon after they entered the town, the German garrison surrendered late on the afternoon of 4 November. This bravery and daring came at a heavy cost: 84 (some sources say 122) New Zealanders were killed in the assault on the town.

In August 1919, Adam returned to New Zealand. In October 1919, he was discharged from the New Zealand Expeditionary Force. He did not rejoin the Audit Department.

Adam died in 1968.

Although it is uncertain as to which 'John Gordon' the watch was presented to, the following background information is offered regarding the presenters of this WWI Token of Honour:

Iraia Te Whaiti, also known as Iraia Te Ama and Te Ama-o-te-rangi, was born in south Wairarapa, probably in 1861 or 1862. He was the eldest child of Te Rangihakahaka Te Whaiti and Hine-ki-te-rangi, both of Ngati Kahungunu of Wairarapa. His mother was the sister of Hoani Paraone Tunuiarangi, a noted Ngati Kahungunu leader and tribal historian. Iraia had two full brothers, Hoani Te Whaiti (Tutu Hone Paraone) and Patito, and one half-brother, Meiha Keepa Hiu (Hui) Te Miha.

Iraia Te Whaiti received an extensive education in the traditions and genealogies of the many hapu of Ngati Kahungunu of Wairarapa. In later life he was regarded as a leading expert, and wrote a number of articles in Te Puke ki Hikurangi and other publications. He himself strongly identified with Ngati Ngapu-o-te-rangi, centred in the Whakatotomoto Valley, Palliser Bay; he also had strong links with Ngati Hinewaka. It is likely that Hoani Tunuiarangi was responsible for Te Whaiti's education in tribal history, and he became the guardian of his interests following the deaths of Te Rangihakahaka in 1870 and Hine-ki-te-rangi in 1875.

Te Whaiti inherited land interests in a number of south Wairarapa blocks through both his parents, most notably around the southern coast and in the Whakatotomoto valley. Although remaining a staunch Anglican, he was supportive from the turn of the century of Te Hahi o te Ruri Tuawhito o Ihowa (also called the Church of the Seven Rules of Jehovah), founded by Haimona Patete. Te Whaiti considered he was following the direction of the prophet Paora Te Potangaroa, when, as a service to his people, he began farming his ancestral land in 1881.

That year, on 1 November according to a family Bible, Te Whaiti married Kaihau Te Rangikakapi Maikara Aporo, of Ngati Hinewaka and Ngati

Kauhi hapu of Ngati Kahungunu, and of Ngai Tahu and Ngati Maniapoto. Te Whaiti and Kaihau had 13 children; seven of these died at a young age, largely as the result of various epidemics.

In 1894 Te Whaiti extended the range of his farming activities. He entered into a partnership with a Pakeha farmer, John Sinclair, and bought the huge Whatarangi station from Charles Pharazyn for approximately £10,000. Some of the station was still in Maori ownership at this time, and had been leased by Pharazyn. Sinclair and Te Whaiti bought the rights to the leases. The partnership subsequently became known as Te Whaiti and Sutherland when Mary Sutherland took over from her brother. In 1907 Kaiwaru was added to the holding. Later, Te Whaiti purchased Te Karanga, a block of 770 acres, in his own right. In 1912 he estimated the size of his holdings at 18,000 acres; at this time Whatarangi station carried some 20,000 sheep and nearly 500 cattle. Te Whaiti employed a number of the local hapu in shearing and other activities on the station.

Te Whaiti was one of the few Maori engaged in buying land, and his purchase and operation of the station broke a 40-year pattern of Maori land alienation in the Wairarapa Valley. In 1908 only 140,000 acres of land remained in Maori ownership; of this, only 33,000 acres were being farmed by the owners. Te Whaiti owned at least as much livestock as all other Wairarapa Maori farmers combined. He experimented with various methods of farming and employed Pakeha as well as Maori workers.

Te Whaiti's expertise in land management was utilised by the wider Wairarapa Maori community. He was elected to the management committee of the reserves for the Wairarapa lakes, and to the management committee of Pouakani, a block of over 30,000 acres situated at present-day Mangakino; it was given to Wairarapa hapu by the government in exchange for the Wairarapa lakes. Te Whaiti also wrote a number of items about farming and agricultural techniques in Te Puke ki Hikurangi.

He was also elected to a number of other committees to represent the interests of his family and hapu. He was the chairperson of the committee of the Kohunui marae, and was a member of the management committee at Papawai pa, the site of the Maori parliament. In 1906 he was elected to the Rongokako Maori Council, the principal governing body of Wairarapa Maori society in the 20 years following 1900. Later he became deputy chairman. He remained a member of the council until at least 1912. In addition, Te Whaiti was a lieutenant in the Wairarapa Mounted Rifle Volunteers, a Maori military company, and was a director of the Mareikura Company, which published a newspaper.

In later life Te Whaiti moved with his family to Te Karearea, a large house in Greytown. He and Kaihau became popular figures in Greytown public life, and took part in a number of community activities. The couple made donations to various public works, and were prominent in the patriotic fund-raising society during the First World War. About 1908 Iraia became a Freemason - the first Maori to do so.

Te Whaiti died from influenza in Greytown on 15 November 1918. He was buried at Ranana cemetery, in the Whakatotomoto valley; a stone memorial was erected by his family in 1923. At the time of his death his considerable personal wealth was estimated at £36,000. The Te Whaiti and Sutherland partnership was dissolved at his death, and his holdings were divided between his three surviving sons; there were also three surviving daughters. Kaihau lived for another 18 years at Te Karearea in Greytown, before she died on 19 January 1937. She was buried next to her husband at Ranana.

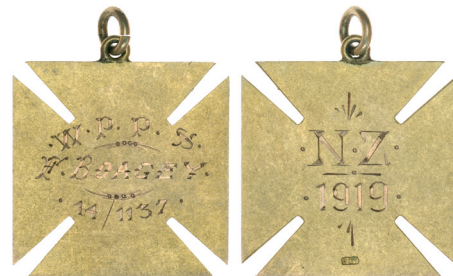

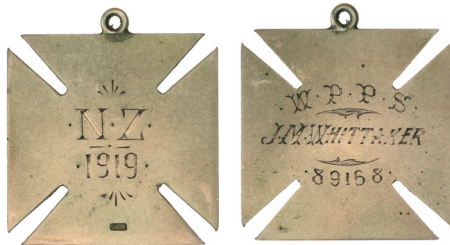

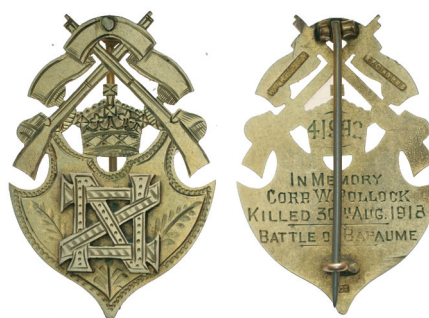
