

Subsequently a gold medal was granted as an annual prize by Her Majesty.

James Eastwick, only son of Rev James Eastwick of Stamford, entered Rugby School in 1863 aged 12, matriculated in 1869, Exhibitioner 1869, University College, Oxford Scholar 1869, First Class Classical Moderations 1871, B.A. First Class Final Classics 1873, Fellow of Trinity College 1873, First Class in Law 1874, B.C.L. and D.C.L. 1876, Eldon Law Scholar, Barrister-at-Law, Lincoln's Inn 1877.
