A series of wars involving French, Spanish and Swiss forces had devastated Savoy, and by 1536 Francis I had brought the duchy under complete French rule. Emanuele in exile served the King of Spain, as governor-general of the Lowlands, and in 1557 delivered a devastating defeat to the French at St. Quentin.
